

Functionality

What is MOBIDERM?

MOBIDERM is a medical device for mobilizing the subcutaneous tissue. It consists of foam blocks enclosed between two non-woven fabrics. The MOBIDERM technology can be used under a relief bandage (in the form of a bandage or a pillow) or integrated into mobilizing garments.

Due to the pressure difference between the contact surface of the blocks and their surroundings, it promotes lymph flow and optimizes drainage efficiency¹. This also has a positive influence on wound healing, the optimized drainage efficiency favours wound healing due to the optimization of metabolism (removal of waste products through drainage).



Pathology

What is a genital and pelvic lymphedema?

- Lymphedema is a swelling of one or more parts of the body¹
- Genital lymphedema is frequently accompanied by unilateral or bi-lateral lower extremity lymphedemas²
- Genital lymphedema is usually a result of genital cancer management
- They are still insufficiently diagnosed at the initial stage, poorly managed and progress towards the final stages resulting in complications, disability and impairment of the quality of life
- This pathology is difficult to accept for the patient, to manage for the healthcare professionals and to find the right device to deliver for fitters
- Indeed, the management is complex, due to the location of the lymphedema³

Clinical study – Olympy-Study⁴

What is this clical study?

There is very few studies about genital and pelvic lymphedema and no dedicated device available on the market, so patient have to combine several solutions.

It's a reason why Thuasne has conducted the Olympy Study to have a better understanding of this population and its needs and the acceptance of our new Mobiderm Intimate Shorts device.

This study was conducted, with 32 patients, for 3 months, in 3 centers in France: Toulouse with Dr. Malloizel, Montpellier, with Dr. Mestre, Paris, with Dr. Vignes.

What are the results of this study?

78.6% of patients – improvement of their quality of life **61% of patients** – better quality of life after 3 months

95% of patients – want to keep a product after the end of the study

Solution

Our new MOBIDERM Intimate Shorts (References 3736 01 for women and 3737 01 for men) is a dedicated device for men and women with a pelvic and/or genital edema.

This product includes a compression shorts and a genital mobilization pad with the Mobiderm technology. Small blocks of the pad allow to adapt to the specific location of the lymphedema.

How THUASNE's innovative MOBIDERM pad works:

The compression pad consists of small foam cubes (5x5 mm) generating a pressure differential between the cubes' contact surface and the adjacent surroundings, thus mobilizing the subcutaneous tissue and increasing lymph drainage.

This product is certified by OEKO-TEK® certification since january 2022, tested by IFTH (Institut Français du Textile-Habillement).


Mobiderm Intimate Shorts is a compression and mobilization shorts for the treatment of pelvic and genital lymphedema, available in 6 sizes, with a version dedicated for men and a version dedicated for women, to adapt respective anatomies.

Equipment – ready to wear

- Compression shorts with targeted compression on the genitals and pelvis
- Removable genital mobilization pad

Indication: These garments are indicated in the treatment of pelvic and genital lymphedema.

Mode of action: Provide compression around the pelvis and buttock, to encourage lymphatic drainage and help maintain or reduce swelling.

Breast cancer related edema


2-3 out of 10 women develop lymphedema as a result of radiation or removal of lymph nodes.

Whether after ablation or breast conservation therapy (BCS), oedema can occur either immediately after surgery as acute oedema or even years later as chronic mammary and/or chest wall oedema.

Studies estimate that more than 1.5 million patients worldwide have breast cancer-related oedema.

Due to the increased use of breast-conserving surgery and the lymph node-sparing SLN method, there is less arm lymphedema, as Dr Netopil's evaluation shows.¹

More and more chest wall and/or breast oedema is occurring due to the increasing number of breast-conserving operations in combination with radiation.



Solution

Our new compression lymph MOBIDERM Intimate bra (Reference T57130) provides optimum care for women suffering from mammary and thoracic wall edemas. The bra is specially conceived for the needs of women who had breast cancer surgery. After plastic breast surgery, it has a formstabilizing and relieving effect and provides support with the compression and drainage of edemas which may develop after breast cancer treatment.

Thanks to its integrated compression pad, the **MOBIDERM**Intimate bra exerts increased pressure on those tissue areas affected by edemas. Lymph drainage will thus be significantly improved. Moreover, controlled compression in the scar tissue area will minimize the development of hematomas.
